Present the primary prompt to the student. Read the following prompt exactly as it appears below.

Primary Prompt:

In 1215, the people in England created the Magna Carta, an outline for government. Which source should a student use to find out what a person in England in 1215 thought about the Magna Carta?

Point to and read each answer option aloud:

Map, Diary, Encyclopedia

Choose your answer.

The student receives a score of 4 for a correct response.

If the student does not respond, repeat the primary prompt and answer options <u>only once</u>, exactly as they appear. If the student responds correctly after the second presentation of the primary prompt, the student receives a score of 4.


The student receives a score of 2 for a correct response.
