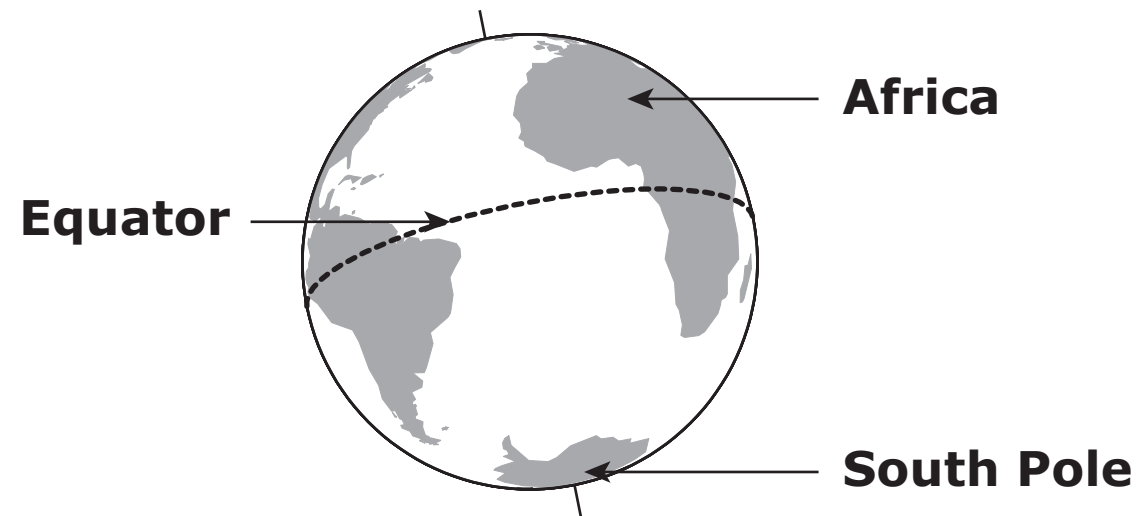


Item 00:

Present the primary prompt to the student. Point to the picture at the top of the student-facing page and read the following prompt exactly as it appears below. Primary Prompt: The tilt of Earth on its axis affects the climate. Which location on Earth has the coldest climate? Point to and read each answer option aloud: Africa, Equator, South Pole Choose your answer. The student receives a score of 4 for a correct response. If the student does not respond, repeat the primary prompt and answer options <i>only once</i>, exactly as they appear. If the student responds correctly after the second presentation of the primary prompt, the student receives a score of 4. If the student responds incorrectly or does not respond after repeating the primary prompt, move to Level 3.	4
Turn the page and present the additional prompt to the student. Present the primary prompt and answer options again, exactly as they appear above. The student receives a score of 3 for a correct response. If the student does not respond or responds incorrectly, move to Level 2.	3
Point to the correct answer and read aloud: The South Pole has the coldest climate. Present the primary prompt and answer options again, exactly as they appear above. The student receives a score of 2 for a correct response. If the student does not respond or responds incorrectly, move to Level 1.	2
If the student responds incorrectly at Level 2, the student receives a score of 1.	1
If the student does not respond at Level 2, the student receives a score of No Response (NR).	NR

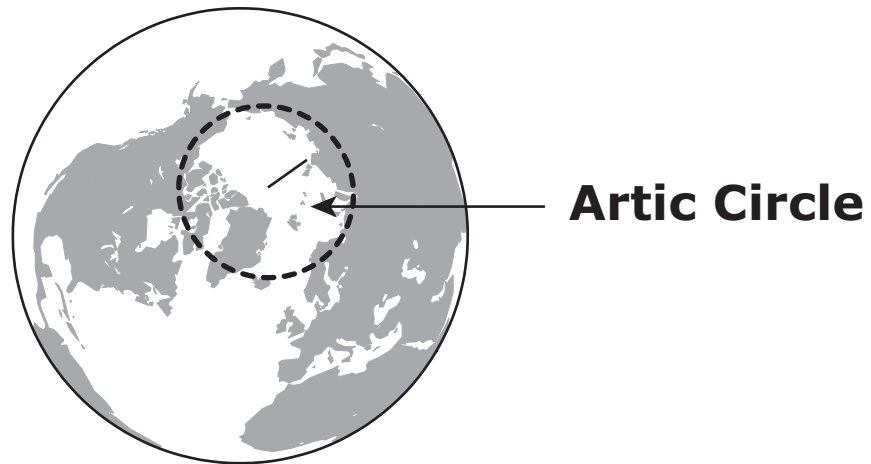
