CMAS: TestNav Chromebook Support Update for 2025–26 CMAS Administration

What's Changing?

Google is phasing out support for legacy Chrome Apps. In response, TestNav will release a new Web App for ChromeOS in late June 2025 and retire the legacy Chrome App.

Why This Matters

The move to a Progressive Web App (PWA) simplifies support across devices. Starting July 2025, the TestNav Web App (v8.25) will be required for all Chromebook testing.

What You Need to Do This Summer

- 1. Uninstall the legacy TestNav Chrome App.
- 2. Install the new TestNav Web App via the Google Admin Console:

Steps:

- 3. Sign in to your Google Admin Console.
- 4. Go to Devices > Chrome > Apps & extensions.
- 5. Click the Kiosks tab.
- 6. Select the organizational unit you want to apply the app to (use the top-level OU for all users).
- 7. Click the yellow + button, then choose Add by URL.
- 8. Enter: https://home.testnav.com/ and click Save.
- 9. When prompted, allow permissions for the app by selecting Agree.

Reminder: This Web App is not available in the Chrome Web Store—it must be installed by URL.

CMAS: 2025 Spring Administration Analytics – Key Takeaways from Pearson

Pearson has released <u>Administration Analytics</u> from the 2025 CMAS spring testing window. Below are the most important insights:

- 1. **1,262,941 test units** were administered during the week of **April 14** alone.
- 2. Chrome OS dominated, powering over 80% of testing devices—accounting for 1,866,014 test units.

- 3. 53% of Colorado testers used Proctor Caching.
- 4. **Over 374,000 testers** experienced a **20–30 second delay** at login due to **misconfigured local cache**, preventing them from connecting at the start of the test.

Actionable Insight:

District tech teams should double-check local cache configurations ahead of future test windows to reduce login delays and improve the student experience.

CMAS: Legislative Update - Paper CMAS Available as Accommodation Only Starting in 2026

What's Happening?

Governor Polis signed **HB 25-1278** into law on **May 23, 2025**. This legislation is based on 30 recommendations from the **1241 Task Force** and makes significant updates to Colorado's **Education Accountability System**.

Key Areas Addressed:

- State assessments
- Performance framework updates
- Public reporting
- Data availability
- Continuous improvement and the accountability clock
- Topics for future study

What You Need to Know:

Starting in spring 2026, schools will no longer be able to select paper-based CMAS testing at the school or district level. The paper-pencil format will only be allowed as an accommodation for students with a documented need in their IEP or 504 plan.

Please share information about this change with **all schools in your district**, including **charter schools**, that currently administer paper assessments of this change.

ACCESS: Upcoming DRC INSIGHT Updates - Action Required by July 31, 2025

DRC will release its annual technology updates for WIDA ACCESS and WIDA Screener Online on the evening of **June 26, 2025**. Please be aware of the following important changes:

1. DRC INSIGHT for Windows:

Starting **June 27**, technology coordinators may re-enable **automatic updates** for the DRC INSIGHT Windows application. This change allows any user to update the application when prompted. If no action is taken, only users with **Admin rights** will be able to apply updates.

2. DRC INSIGHT for Chromebooks - Now a PWA:

Also on **June 27**, the Chromebook version of DRC INSIGHT will be released as a **Progressive Web Application (PWA)**. Technology coordinators must:

- Uninstall the current Secure App (version 15) from all Chrome devices.
- Install the new PWA version of DRC INSIGHT.

These steps must be completed by **July 31, 2025**, to prevent disruptions during testing. If you missed it, more details were shared in the <u>May 20 WIDA AMS and DRC Technical</u> <u>Enhancements for 2025-2026 assessment webinar</u>.
