The Financial Transparency webpage Previously built & maintained by an external vendor (BrightBytes) Successful migration to in-house development at CDE

- Go-Live date was 07/01/2022
 - <u>Link</u> will automatically re-direct users, but should be updated
- Modifications to Construction, Debt, Refinancing & Other section (district level only)
 - FY18-19 and FY19-20 figures excluded object 07xx and 09xx in the totals on the BrightBytes site
 - This omission was corrected for FY19, FY20 and FY21 on new Financial Transparency site
 - Object 0735 moved to 'Supplies' within appropriate program category in accordance with National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) guidance
- Expanded Per-pupil Expenditures (district level) to match school level PPE
- Per-pupil expenditures removed for all but two BOCES
- Improved search tools
- Download tools include descriptive, statewide district & school level files



Financial Transparency - Update URL on District and Charter School Webpages

The URL to the new site is different than the URL used by the BrightBytes site

The historical weblink* will automatically redirect users to the new <u>Financial Transparency</u> page on the CDE website, however, all districts/BOCES/Charter Schools *should update the links on their Financial Transparency webpage(s) to the new URL this fall, FY22-23.*

- Here's the full link to the new site: (<u>https://www.cde.state.co.us/schoolview/financialtransparency/homepage</u>). Use of this link will take users to the home page of the new Financial Transparency website which contains FY2020-2021 data.
- Alternatively, you may link directly to your district/school data rather than the site's Homepage
 - As an example, Mapleton's 4-digit district code is 0010 so the URL that takes users directly to Mapleton's Financial Transparency data is as follows: <u>https://www.cde.state.co.us/schoolview/financialtransparency/organizations/0010</u>.
- *<u>Note the redirect will only work using 'http:' (rather than 'https</u>:'). For this reason, it is
 recommended that the links on all webpages are updated to reflect the new URL noted above.

Modifications to Construction, Debt, Refinancing & Other Category

Modifications to Construction, Debt, Refinancing & Other section (district level only)

- FY18-19 and FY19-20 figures excluded object codes* 07xx and 09xx in the totals for this section on the BrightBytes site
- This omission was corrected for FY18-19, FY19-20 and FY20-21 on new Financial Transparency site

* (except object 0735)



Object 0735 was historically reported as part of capital outlay (Construction, Debt, Refinancing & Other section)

However, due to unprecedented federal COVID-19 relief funding and large purchases of technology-related supplies (such as tablets for online/remote learning during school closures) additional reporting requirements identified the need to reclass these expenditures

 Object 0735 expenditures were moved to the 'Supplies' line within the appropriate program category in accordance with guidance from the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES)




Financial Reporting Updates Financial Transparency Per-Pupil Expenditures

Our federal partners requested breakdown of Per-Pupil Expenditures (PPE) by Federal & State/Local sources to meet ESSA report card requirements

• We also included District/School-level vs Central Spending Per Student (similar to school-level PPE details)









The Per-Pupil Expenditure (PPE) figures were removed from all but two of the BOCES

- The figures were distorted (ie \$88k per student) because the BOCES' serve students from all of their member districts, but don't actually have a 'student/membership' count
 - BOCES with a school also serve students from their member districts
 but their membership count only includes students at the school operated by the BOCES
- Two BOCES are the exception and PPE is displayed on the website:
 - Expeditionary BOCES (9130)
 - Education reEnvisionsed BOCES (9170)

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CDE used the 4-digit district or school code as the identifier on the site

Districts & Charter Schools may direct users directly to the data for their district/BOCES (optional)

 As an example, Mapleton's 4-digit district code is 0010 – so the URL that takes users directly to Mapleton's Financial Transparency data is as follows:

https://www.cde.state.co.us/schoolview/financialtransparency/organiz ations/0010.

In the same way, the site's search button also works to look up a district/BOCES/school by name or by its 4-digit district or school code in (as well as by name)

About the Public School Financial Transparency Act



About the Public School Financial Transparency Act

Section 22-44-300, et. seq., C.R.S.

With the passage of <u>HB 10-1036 (PDF)</u>, The General Assembly enacted the "Public School Financial Transparency Act", which directs local education providers to post financial information on-line, in a downloadable format, for free public access.

Pursuant to <u>HB 14-1292 (PDF)</u>, the <u>Financial Policies and Procedures Advisory Committee</u> of the Department created templates included below for use by local education providers needing assistance with the on-line posting of the information specified.

Timeline for Compliance

- All documents must be posted or updated within 60 days after completion or receipt of the applicable report, statement or document.
- Prior two budget years' financial information shall be maintained on-line, in a downloadable format, for free public access, until the end of the current budget year.
