Extended Part C in the Transition from Early Intervention (EI)







Your Service Coordinator (SC) will work with you on a transition plan to ensure your child receives supports and services based on their needs after Early Intervention (EI) ends.

Between 2 years, 3 months and 2 years 6 months:

1. Your SC will Notify Your School District/BOCES**

Between 2 years, 3 months and 2 years 9 months

- 1. With your permission your SC will send additional information about your child to the School District/BOCES
- 2. Transition Conference a meeting with your SC and the
- 3. School District/BOCES to talk about Special Education in preschool
- 4. SC will explain and provide a copy of "A Look at Your Rights and Options after Your Child Turns Three" that includes a comparison between EI and Preschool Special Education Services

Prior to Age Three

- 1. Your School District/BOCES will schedule a screening/evaluation
- 2. If determined eligible an Individualized Education Program (IEP) will be developed to support your child in preschool

If you choose the Extended Part C Option for your child:

- 1. Consent for Extended Part C signed
- 2. With your SC, you will review and revise as needed your IFSP to include school readiness
- 3. EI services will continue until the beginning of next school year.

If your child does not qualify for Special Education or you do not choose the Extended Part C Option

1. EI services will end on your child's third birthday
