# Summer 2024 Updates





# Non-Congregate Meals

- Rural areas without access to congregate summer meals
- Flexibility for meal distribution
  - Grab n' go
  - Parent/guardian pickup
  - Home delivery
  - Multiple meals (10 days' worth)
  - Bulk meals (5 days' worth)





# Non-Congregate Eligibility

- Eligible sponsors in good standing
- Rural site location
  - Rural Designation Map
- No access to congregate meals
  - Capacity Builder Map





# Non-Congregate Eligibility

 Non-congregate site is rural and area eligible: may claim all meals

 Non-congregate site is rural and NOT area eligible: only claim meals for free or reducedprice eligible youth



# Non-Congregate Meals

#### Considerations:

- Program integrity must be maintained
  - Serving to eligible youth and prohibiting duplicate meals
- Food Safety

Combination sites





# Non-Congregate Meals

#### Considerations:

- Home delivery
  - Invite eligible households
  - Receive household consent
  - Confirm household information
- Reporting requirements
  - o Congregate vs. non-congregate meals

Summer Food Service Program Training



#### **Sponsor Training**

A program administrator and/or key staff members from each sponsoring organization are required annually to complete the CDE School Nutrition training to participate in the SFSP. Documentation of training (certificate or training agenda) should be kept for all staff that receive training for the SFSP.

The required annual training consists of an online training course and a live webinar. You will need to log-in and have a Moodle account in order to complete the training.

All program staff must be trained on civil rights requirements each year.



- CO School District Maps
- <u>USDA Capacity Builder Map</u>
  - Tool to help with identifying potential site locations
  - Can layer different data to visualize gaps in service





# Site Monitoring

### Pre-Operational Visits

- New sites
- Sites new to noncongregate
- Sites with operational problems in the previous year
- Complete before beginning operations



- New sites
- Sites new to noncongregate
- Sites with operational problems in the previous year
- First two weeks of operations



- All sites
- First four weeks of operations
- Can be combined with site visit within the first two weeks of operation

### Meal Patterns

#### Breakfast

- 8 fl oz milk
- 1/2 cup fruit or vegetable
- 1 serving grain
- Optional: 1 oz meat/meat alternate

#### Lunch/Supper

- 8 fl oz milk
- 3/4 cup fruit or vegetable (2 items)
- 1 serving grain
- 2 oz meat/meat alternate



#### Snack

Serve any 2 of the 4:

- 8 fl oz mik
- 3/4 cup fruit or vegetable
- 1 serving grain
- 1 oz meat/meatalternate



### Offer versus Serve

- Available for all congregate and non-congregate sponsors
- Children must be able to take/decline more than just milk



**SFSP OVS Overview** 



### Meal Service Times

• Removes previous meal time restrictions

 Breakfast must be served close to the beginning of the day

 At least 1 hour must elapse between end of 1 meal service and beginning of another



# Civil Rights

- Train all staff annually
- Include the nondiscrimination statement
- Civil Rights webpage





### Collecting Racial and Ethnic Data

- Collect racial and ethic data annually
  - Racial/Ethnic Data Form
  - Visual Identification is no longer allowed
- Use self-identification or aggregate data from site area
