HB19-1016 - Basic Skills Placement Tests For High School
 Postponed indefinitely 1/31/2019

- SB18-225 Definition of Early College High Schools

HOUSE BILL 19-1121 – Early College Preamended 2/13/19

Measure to support students who enroll in postsecondary courses during 5th year of high school

For budget years 2018-19 through 2022-23, a district may include in its pupil enrollment pupils who are enrolled in a school that was designated pursuant to section 22-35-103 (10) as an early college before June 6, 2018, and who, after completing four years of high school, enroll for the 2018-19, 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22, or 2022-23 budget year in postsecondary courses



HOUSE BILL 19-1121 - ASCENT Preamended 2/13/19

Effective beginning in the 2021-22 budget year

The bill directs the department to <u>first</u> designate from among:

- ✓ students who meet existing criteria (in C.R.S. 22-35-108), and
- ✓ who meet additional criteria that indicate he/she is likely to complete a high-demand postsecondary certificate/degree during the ASCENT program year
- ➤ CEAB must consult with several departments, the governing boards of state higher education institutions, and local education providers to develop guidelines for implementing the prioritization requirement
 - a) has earned 24 or more postsecondary credits by end of 12th grade year;
 - b) is scheduled to complete a postsecondary certificate/degree program during the ASCENT year; and
 - c) is enrolled in a postsecondary certificate or degree program that is in high demand in Colorado (per guidelines adopted by the CEAB)

Allocate any remaining slots to all other eligible students.



Concurrent Enrollment

- At no tuition cost to the qualified student/parent
- LEP shall not limit # of postsecondary courses in enrolled in during 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grades except to degree that LEP is unable to provide access due to technological capacity
- Qualified student must receive credit that applies to completion of high school graduation requirements and postsecondary credit that applies toward completion of basic skills requirements or requirements for completion of a postsecondary certificate/degree program at one or more Colorado IHEs
- Priority given to students that will have completed high school graduation requirements by the time they concurrently enroll and will begin earning credits toward postsecondary degree/certificate, or to complete required basic skills courses during the 12th grade.



Concurrent Enrollment- new notification requirements

- 22-53-104 (III)
 - Number and transferability of course credits that student may earn by enrolling in CE course
 - LEP may not refer to enrolment in a program or course as CE if the program of course does not meet the definition of concurrent enrollment
 - No tuition cost options
 - IHE shall inform the LEP of transferability and costs for books and fees



CE Cooperative Agreement must include:

- Amount and transferability of academic credit to be granted for postsecondary course successfully completed by students
- Requirement that postsecondary coursework completed by students qualifies as basic skills credit or academic credit applicable toward earning degree/certificate at that and one or more IHEs with the state
- Requirement that CA include provisions on data sharing

Additional provisions:

Allows for LEP to contract with other LEPs to share CE courses taught by LEP staff



• CE Expansion and Innovation Grant Program

- Beginning with 2020-21 school year subject to available appropriations
- Provide grants to partnerships of LEPs and IHEs (can be multiple LEP and IHE partners) that seek to being offering or expanding capacity to offer CE opportunities to eligible students
- Application approved by SBE
- CDE reviews applications and submits recommendations to SBE

College in High School Programs

States Need to Grow Their Workforce with the Right Credentials

- CEAB subcommittee to examine, align, and promote college in high school programs as potential solutions to meet the workforce needs of in-demand industry sectors and employers in the state.
- Use existing platforms to guide this work (Careers in Colorado, TalentFound, existing curriculum guides as models, expand workforce connections and internship and practicum opportunities, CareerWise)
- Create a start-up fund to launch new career-focused college in high school programs with school districts, higher education, and industry partners.
- Take advantage of new federal opportunities under Perkins V, as well as existing opportunities under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), to enhance college in high school CTE courses.
