Description/Summary

Check and Connect was developed using 18 years of research to determine the essential factors to prevent drop out and promote graduation.

Momentum came in the 1990s from 3 key events:

- Concerns about graduation rates became a Federal priority under the legislation of the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB).
- School dropout was considered by many to be a crisis.
- High cost of unemployment and criminal activity could no longer be ignored.


Key Components – Check & Connect

There are *Four Components* of Check and connect:

1. A mentor who keeps education salient for students
2. Systematic monitoring (the “check” component)
3. Timely and individualized intervention (the “connect” component)
4. Enhancing home-school communication and home support for learning.
