LSTA Grant Application Review Process

This is a competitive grant application and review process. Each LSTA grant application must stand on its own merit. The staff at the Colorado State Library and teams of volunteer peer reviewers will evaluate all applications and recommend projects for funding that meet eligibility and scoring criteria as defined in the <u>LSTA Grant Application Rubric</u>.

Final grant awards are subject to approval by the Assistant Commissioner of the State Library and the Commissioner of the Department of Education.

Only the awarded grant applications shall be considered public information. Working papers, individual reviewer's comments, notes, and scores are not public information. Selection Process

Applications will be funded that best meet the purpose of the grant offering and address the stated goal(s) from *Colorado's LSTA Five Year Plan (2008-2012)*. The number of projects recommended for funding depends on availability of funds.
