Census Day is April 1, 2020. Through a series of workshops conducted by 2020 Census partnership specialists, join a powerful movement in Colorado of local government, nonprofit, corporate and community organizations finding solutions to count everyone once, only once and in the right place. With full participation, the once-a-decade population count will drive more than \$13 billion dollars in federal funds annually into Colorado, including assistance to schools and their families¹.

Thousands of Colorado children were missed in the 2010 Census – an estimated 5 percent below the age of 5. We are at risk of losing millions of annual federal dollars and inadequately planning for schools, hospitals and roads. We need your help to close this gap in 2020. Together, we'll engage families in areas that, based on demographic, socioeconomic and housing characteristics, may be hard to count.

A census is a massive and vitally important undertaking. We need your help to ensure a complete and accurate count. Whatever time and resources you can commit, you can make a difference in Colorado.
